Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates 2 New Hampshire Counties as Contiguous Natural Disaster Area Due to Severe Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides

**Primary area Vermont*

This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Vermont and New Hampshire

Triggering Disaster: Severe Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides that occurred between July 29 to July 31, 2024

Application Deadline: May 27, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible:

Vermont: Caledonia, Essex, and Orleans

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

New Hampshire: Coos and Grafton

Vermont: Franklin, Lamoille, Orange, and Washington
