

USDA Designates 12 Counties in AZ as Primary Natural Disaster

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WASHINGTON, March 14, 2018 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has designated 12 counties in **Arizona** as <u>primary natural disaster areas</u> due to losses and damages caused by a recent drought. Those counties are:

Apache	Gila	Maricopa	Pima
Cochise	Graham	Mohave	Pinal
Coconino	Greenlee	Navajo	Santa Cruz

Farmers and ranchers in the contiguous counties in La Paz, Yavapai and Yuma in **Arizona** also qualify for natural disaster assistance.

Farmers and ranchers in the contiguous counties in **California**, **Colorado**, **Nevada**, **New Mexico** and **Utah** also qualify for natural disaster assistance. Those counties are:

California San Bernardino

Colorado Montezuma

Nevada Clark and Lincoln

New Mexico Catron, Cibola, Grant, Hidalgo, McKinley and San Juan

Utah

Kane, San Juan and Washington

Qualified farm operators in the designated areas eligible for the Farm Service Agency's (FSA's) <u>emergency</u> (<u>EM</u>) <u>loans</u>, provided eligibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible counties have eight months from the date of the declaration of March 8, 2018, to apply for loans to help cover part of their actual losses. FSA will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. FSA has a variety of programs, in addition to the EM loan program, to help eligible farmers recover from the impacts of this disaster.

Other FSA programs that can provide assistance, but do not require a disaster declaration, include: <u>Operating and</u> <u>Farm Ownership Loans</u>; the <u>Emergency Conservation Program</u>; <u>Livestock Forage Disaster Program</u>; <u>Livestock</u> <u>Indemnity Program</u>; <u>Emergency Assistance for Livestock</u>, <u>Honeybees and Farm-Raised Fish Program</u>; and the <u>Tree Assistance Program</u>.
