Emergency Designation | September 23, 2021

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through emergency loans. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Montana

Triggering Disaster #1: Hail that occurred on July 6, 2021

Application Deadline: May 20, 2022

Primary County Eligible: Toole

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Glacier, Liberty and Pondera

Triggering Disaster #2: Hail that occurred on July 11, 2021

Application Deadline: May 20, 2022

Primary Counties Eligible: Liberty and Toole

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Chouteau, Glacier, Hill and Pondera

Triggering Disaster #3: Hail that occurred on July 21, 2021

Application Deadline: May 20, 2022

Primary County Eligible: Toole

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Glacier, Liberty and Pondera

Triggering Disaster #4: Wildfire that occurred on Aug. 8 through Aug. 22, 2021

Application Deadline: May 20, 2022

Primary County Eligible: Rosebud

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Big Horn, Custer, Garfield, Musselshell, Petroleum, Powder
