Biden Administration Appoints Marcy Svenningsen to Serve as State Executive Director for USDA's Farm Service Agency in North Dakota

WASHINGTON, March 2, 2022— The Biden Administration recently appointed Marcy Svenningsen as the new State Executive Director (SED) for the USDA North Dakota Farm Service Agency (FSA). Svenningsen joined the North Dakota FSA team on Feb. 28, 2022.

"Individuals selected to serve as FSA State Executive Directors are incredible public servants who have a proven track record when it comes to their commitment to advance their states and communities," said Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack. "Each will serve on the frontlines, carrying out USDA's mission at the state level and ensuring the voice of each and every USDA customer is heard. We are fortunate to have each of these talented individuals at this critical time for farmers and producers and rural communities across America."

Svenningsen and her husband own and operate a farm and ranch near Valley City, North Dakota, where they produce wheat, corn, soybeans and feed. For over thirty years, she worked as the Finance Director for the Valley City Open Door Center, a non-profit corporation that provides services to individuals with disabilities. For eight years, Svenningsen served as the Chair of the USDA Farm Service Agency State Committee in North Dakota and for twelve years, served as a District Director on the North Dakota Farmers Union board. Most recently, she served as chair of the Cass County Electric Cooperative board of directors and on the Minnkota Power Cooperative board of directors. Svenningsen graduated with a degree in Accounting from Valley City State University.

As SED, Svenningsen will be responsible for overseeing the delivery of FSA programs to agricultural producers in North Dakota. These commodity, conservation, credit, and disaster assistance programs ensure a safe, affordable, abundant, and nutritious food, fiber, and fuel supply for consumers.

"The State Executive Director is a pivotal leadership position for the Agency and for the agricultural producers we serve," said Marcus Graham, FSA Deputy Administrator for Field Operations. "These leaders, appointed by the Biden-Harris Administration, bring a wealth of knowledge and expertise to

their respective states. We are happy to have them on board and wish them much success."

The Agency offers producers a strong safety net through the administration of farm commodity and disaster programs.
