

Winnebago & Worth Counties Designated by USDA as Disaster Areas Due to Drought

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A Secretarial Disaster Designation has been issued for 11 counties in Minnesota as primary disaster areas for drought. Additionally, two lowa counties are contiguous to the disaster area. This determination will allow the Farm Service Agency's Emergency Loans to be made available to eligible family farmers with qualifying production and physical losses in the primary and the contiguous counties to the declared disaster area.

Emergency Loan Application Deadline: April 8, 2024
Primary Counties Eligible: Primary counties located in Minnesota
Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Winnebago and Worth (lowa)
Disaster Description: Drought. June 13, 2023, beginning date of incident period.
