

Three Iowa Counties Impacted by Recent USDA Disaster Designation

A Secretarial Disaster Designation has been issued for 12 counties in Wisconsin as primary disaster areas for drought. Additionally, three (3) Iowa counties are contiguous to the disaster area. This determination will allow the Farm Service Agency's Emergency Loans to be made available to eligible family farmers with qualifying production and physical losses in the primary and the contiguous counties to the declared disaster area.

Primary Counties Eligible: Multiple Counties in Wisconsin
Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Allamakee, Clayton, Dubuque (Iowa)
Disaster Description: Drought. July 11, 2023, beginning date of incident period.
